

LOCKDOWN ALERT LEVEL 3

INDUSTRIES PERMITTED TO OPERATE

WHAT'S ALLOWED

Full reopening of the retail sector

Sale of alcohol Mon - Thu

Restaurants for delivery or collection of food only

WHAT'S NOT ALLOWED

The consumption of food and beverages at or in a place of sale.

Sale of tobacco

Personal care services, including hairdressing, beauty treatments, make -up, nail salons, piercing and tattoo parlours

Tourist attractions, casinos and entertainment activities

Conferences and events

Short term home-sharing /letting/leasing/rental for leisure purposes

PUBLIC TRANSPORT RESTRICTIONS

WHAT'S ALLOWED

Bus services, taxi services, e-hailing and private motor vehicles may operate at all times of the day, with limitations on vehicle capacity and stringent hygiene requirements

New directives which allow for increased travelling:

- Approved inter-provincial travel to use longdistance public transport (permit is required)
- Airports re-open for necessary domestic business travel (only the 4 majors: ORTIA, Lanseria International, CTIA, KSIA)
- PRASA routes reopen

WHAT'S NOT ALLOWED

Domestic passenger air travel for leisure purposes & all international passenger flights

MOVEMENT RESTRICTIONS

WHAT'S ALLOWED

Schools re-open for all grade 7 & 12 learner other grades will be staggered, with some students returning 6 July and the rest on 3 August

People may only leave their homes for work, to procure groceries and essential services, exercise or perform any of the other activities permitted under Level 3

- Run, cycle or walk exercise times will now be between 06:00 – 18:00
- More than 8 Million people return to work
- Work from home is still encouraged
- Partial reopening of places of worship


TRAFFIC OPERATION RATE (REST OF SA)




SHOPPER FOOTFALL (BY PROVINCE)




